We will only work on our own home, often side-by-side with the future owner who must invest 300 hours of sweat-equity and pay an affordable mortgage.

Did you kn? This home is part of a commitment by Flower City Habitat for Humanity to help revitalize the JOSANA neighborhood by building 100 new homes. The work was inspired by the death of 10-year old Tyshaun Cauldwell who was shot while riding his bike in his driveway in 2001.
